The fight against corruption should include the promotion and implementation of sound ethical, financial and related management practices in all sectors of public life, not least the private sector. Weak institutions for corporate governance not only result in inefficiency but encourage corruption, hence the need for an array of reforms that can be effective in curbing both incentives and opportunities for corruption.

This view accords with the evolving corporate culture around the developing world as the process of setting new standards of ethical behaviour gains momentum. The traditional understanding, that corporations exist solely to make profits for their shareholders, is giving way to a wider corporate social responsibility, not just to customers and clients, but also to the communities and societies in which such corporations operate.

This conference seeks to address compliance standards and challenges in the private sector and to share lessons learnt in fighting corruption in a range of African countries, such as Tunisia, Kenya, Ghana and South Africa. Conference delegates also take a closer look at anti-corruption watchdogs and their effectiveness in preventing and combating corruption. Panellists will represent national anti-corruption bodies, the private sector, academia, as well as civil society.
